Dr Paul Grinzi is a general practitioner who combines clinical work in Romsey (central Victoria) with academic general practice at the Department of General Practice at the University of Melbourne, where he has worked since 2004.



Whilst still a GP registrar, he was selected in 2007 to be the inaugural APHCRI/Robert Graham Centre Visiting Fellow, travelling to Washington DC USA to study a web-based geographic information systems (GIS) tool and to create links with the Graham Centre, the policy and research division of the American Academy of Family Physicians.

Paul has been involved in the Australian General Practice Training program as a member of the Advisory Council to General Practice Registrars Australia (GPRA) and is also a member of the RACGP's Drug and Alcohol committee.

As a young researcher, Paul's academic interests are wide, and he is currently completing a Masters of Medicine research thesis on alcohol management education for GP registrars, whilst also completing clinical diplomas in dermatology and rural general practice. In addition, he has been busy following up work initiated by the 2007 US visit, in the area of the usage of GIS within primary care.
