Ellen Nolte qualified in biology and holds a Master of Public Health degree from Bielefeld University, Germany. In 1998, she was awarded a Marie Curie Fellowship, funded by the European Commission, to undertake her PhD at the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine where she is now working as senior lecturer in the Health Services Research Unit.



She currently holds a Department of Health Career Scientist Award. Her main research is the field of health systems including approaches to health system performance assessment, health system responses to chronic disease, international health care system comparisons, and trends and determinants of population health in former communist countries of central and eastern Europe.
