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Dr Stephen Campbell is a senior research fellow at the Health Sciences Primary Care Research Group at the University of Manchester (and formally National Primary Care Research and Development Centre [NPCRDC]). He holds a joint appointment (20%) at the Department of General Practice, at the University of Heidelberg, Germany, and an honorary contract at University of Nijmegen in the Netherlands. He is an advisor to the German AQUA Institute QISA, which develops quality indicators for Ambulatory Care in Germany. Campbell co-leads the external contractor working with The National Institute of Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE) to support the ongoing development of indicators for the Quality and Outcomes Framework in the United Kingdom. He led the development of Primary Medical Care Provider Accreditation, in collaboration with the Royal College of General Practitioners (RCGP) in the UK, and co-authored the European Practice Assessment accreditation scheme. He is Postgraduate Tutor for Primary Care and teaches primary health care on the University of Manchester Masters in Public Health. Campbell's research interests focus on the quality of primary health care, quality improvement and the development and application of quality indicators. He has over 100 publications.
