




Issues

- Recruitment
 - Lack of suitable applicants
 - Identifying appropriate candidates
- Supervision
 - Understanding mentoring for novice researchers
 - Effective use of mentors
 - Distance and logistics for NW Qld
- Increasing numbers of Novice Researchers
 - Capacity of Aboriginal medical services



Solutions

- Tripartite activities:
 - Induction package for supervisors
 - Information package for potential novice researchers
- Capacity building – academic GPs/allied health
- Develop accredited research training modules for indigenous services
- Federation Research Network
- Use of local contacts
